## Evacuation Procedures – Fire Alarm, Fire, Bomb Threat, Gas Leak, etc.

- Follow evacuation route to nearest exit as marked inside building using stairs, not elevators.
- Account for all participants and personnel following evacuation

## Medical Emergencies- Call 911

- Provide name, exact location, and description of illness/injury and stay on the phone
- Move the victim only if danger is imminent.
- Give first aid if you are trained to do so; have someone bring the AED and first aid kit.
- Have someone meet first responders outside the building to guide them to your location.

# AED and First Aid Kit Location/s

- AED:
- First Aid Kits/Stop the Bleed Kit:

#### Active Shooter – Call 911

- Avoid the threat by fleeing the area if safe to do so (RUN)
- Deny access by hiding and barricading if unable to escape doors locked, lights off, remain silent (HIDE)
- Defend yourself by fighting back as a last resort (FIGHT)
- Remain in place until authorities advise.

# Missing/Abducted/Runaway Minor or Vulnerable Adult: Call 911

- Provide as much information to police as possible
- Identify anyone on site who was last with the person for interview by first responders
- Check camera footage if available
